Pressing on toward the goal

At Christ for all Nations, our team are no strangers to challenge and adversity. Over the years, we've seen how the enemy has tried to stop us from bringing the Good News, in countless different ways. As we prepared for the campaign in Lomé, Togo, it became clear that the "powers of this dark world" were pulling out all the stops to try and prevent the campaign from happening. Not to be deterred, we moved the dates for the campaign, and "pressed on" to win the prize for Jesus.

So, it was with a heightened sense of anticipation that Evangelist Daniel Kolenda opened the first meeting on the Thursday evening. What did God have in store for the people of this West African nation? What "forces of evil" had been disturbed by our arrival and commitment to the task?



Lifting ancient curses

This is the area of the world where voodoo originated, and the effects of these deeply-held beliefs in the power of witchcraft are in plain sight. Many people wear or carry amulets, potions and charms, known locally as "juju", items that have been bought from – or given to them – by witchdoctors, for many different reasons. They instill great fear and superstition in those who possess them. This is a practice that is common all over Africa, and something that we address directly during campaign meetings.

In the first meeting in Lomé, Evangelist Daniel Kolenda led the crowd in renouncing these items, and prayed for every curse to be lifted in Jesus' name. Many people then brought their witchcraft tokens to be burnt in two large drums we had prepared for this purpose. This is normal at any CfaN campaign in Africa. However, what surprised us in Togo was the sheer quantity of items brought, and the intense rejoicing of the people in being freed from them.

In fact, on Saturday night, we witnessed something we've never seen before in all the many years of CfaN campaigns. When the two drums of witchcraft charms had been lit and burnt as usual, so many other people came rushing forward with more items, that the drums were filled again, and burnt for a second time! To burn such things would culturally be seen as very dangerous, so participating in these bonfires shows tremendous faith.

Extra time for the Gospel Trucks

The postponement of the campaign dates for Lomé had an unexpected consequence, that the enemy surely did not see coming. You are probably aware that for the last year or so, we have been training and equipping young evangelists whom we send into cities for weeks ahead of our campaigns to do



local evangelistic outreaches from our mobile Gospel Trucks. They go to many places that our main campaigns cannot reach. They minister in schools, villages, marketplaces, on street corners, on church properties and football fields – anywhere they can attract an audience. Using these trucks, our evangelists will conduct up to three meetings per day.

Well, the Gospel Trucks were already on the ground in Togo when the delay happened, and so we decided to let them continue with the meetings as planned. With an extra month now in play, our team rallied to organize more teams of evangelists, so that the trucks could

be utilized right up until the main event began at the end of March. More time to reach more people, more opportunities to pray for the sick and more places to spread the word about the upcoming Gospel Campaign! That was surely not the enemy's intention.

Two of the twelve evangelists that worked for eight weeks leading up to the event, Jarod Horton and Paul Maurer, remained in Togo to take part in the main event and shared many testimonies with us of salvations and healings that occurred during the pre-campaign mobilization of the Gospel Trucks. God is raising up a new generation of evangelists and getting them fighting fit to spread the Word throughout the world.

Free in spirit, free in body

We often witness how, in a particular place, God seems to move in a powerful way for a special category of illness. Over and again in Lomé, people who had suffered mobility issues came forward to testify that they had been completely healed, as if to demonstrate in their bodies the spiritual freedom that comes with salvation in Jesus Christ. These personal stories told of being unable to move a limb because of illness or injury or debilitating pain, and even of suffering paralysis. One woman who came forward had been reduced to crawling on the ground for 8 months, paralyzed from the waist down. After the prayer for healing, she was completely restored and showed the crowd that she could walk normally once again.

Strong pain in this man's neck and shoulders immobilized his arm. After prayer, all pain has left him and he can move his arm again.

Lighting another kind of fire

In the evening meetings, tens of thousands made the life-altering decision to follow Jesus, for which we give God all the glory. It's incredibly important that these "baby Christians" are immediately placed in loving, mature churches where they can grow and thrive. It's for this reason that, in the mornings during each Gospel Campaign, from Thursday to Saturday, Evangelist Daniel Kolenda and Reverend Peter

Vandenberg get to work training and equipping pastors and church leaders for the task ahead, with a Fire Conference. No matter how organized a pastor is, no matter how great their personality, they cannot fulfil God's vision for their congregation without the fresh, living breath of the Holy Spirit. So, the emphasis of the Fire Conference is on the work of the Holy Spirit, and on making sure each person there is encouraged, inspired and motivated to take hold of God's power in their own lives and in the fellowships they lead.

This woman had had great difficulty with her back for 3 years. During the prayer, she said she felt as if something left her body via her feet. Immediately, she was able to bend at the waist without pain.

For 4 years, she could not lift her arm because of the pain in her shoulder. Doctors couldn't help her, but Jesus healed her, and now she can lift her arm easily.
